Lewis County AAUW Program Meeting May 1, 2025

- President Laura Hewett opened the meeting at 7 pm. She read our Mission Statement. Two new members were welcomed. A sign-up sheet for next year's hostesses was passed around.
- Our guest speaker, Rachel Hunt, J.D., M.P.A., Attorney at Law was introduced. Rachel is a local attorney, specializing in Criminal Defense. Rachel grew up in Chehalis and attended local schools. She graduated from Boise State University where she earned a B.S. degree in Criminal Justice. She returned to the University of Idaho where she earned her Juris Doctorate and Master of Public Administration. Rachel described the stages of defense work. She explained about a new plan now being discussed at the state level to enact case load limits for defense attorneys. A change would mean that defense attorneys would no longer be permitted to take on private clients. Rachel also described the new Chehalis Treatment Court. This court is similar to Drug Court. Attorneys recommend people to take part in this program. The people have to be screened and a judge makes the final decision. Participants take part for twelve months. Housing is not included in the program. Rachel's talk ended when she answered questions from the group.
- Cathy Cavness announced that a new AAUW pamphlet will soon be distributed.
- Julie McDonald Zander has written a book, Shattered Peace, which will be released on May 10, 2025.
- The slate of new officers for the 2025-26 year was listed and approved unanimously. The new officers are: President, Viki Draper; President -elect, Monique Farland; Secretaries, Cheryl Vance, MJ Marsh, and Sharon Winningham; Treasurer, Donna Loucks; Membership, Cathy Cavness and Kathy Halsan; and Programs, Kelly Stanley and Wendy Tripp.
- Monique Farland was congratulated for having a photograph she took being chosen to be on one of the notecards the AAUW national office sells each year.
- Cathy Cavness brought up the plans for the June meeting place. After a lively discussion it was decided that alternative plans would be worked out and announced later.
- Jo Martens mentioned that she had "Authors' Night" tickets and posters available. It was announced that "Hope Alliance" has received a state grant that will allow the program to continue.
- Laura thanked the evening's hostesses Nancy Kruger, Donna Loucks, and Kathy Tennyson.
